Within our school this support has allowed us to continue to provide enhanced learning opportunities, rich experiences, and a diverse range of resources for our students. Doncaster Gardens makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for our parent community.

Within our school in 2026, the financial contributions will assist with: -

- Providing enhanced learning opportunities including targeting student point of need teaching including our student excellence program. This includes Maths Extension program, Orchestra, Choir, leadership programs, Productions, and extra curricular activities.
- Enabling a diverse range of materials especially online subscriptions to be purchased for each child, used both onsite and remotely. Without your support, these online subscriptions would need to be reduced.
- Providing an ICT Centre, coding materials, photocopier in the Year 6 area for student use, purchasing and maintenance of items such as iPads and printers.
- Providing Internet security to student devices and technical support for student/school devices onsite during school hours.
- Providing one off unique opportunities in the Arts such as Performances and tasks such as Ceramics (using our kiln).
- Providing wellbeing and mental health supports and resources.
- Providing medical support and first aid for all students throughout the school day.
- Providing neat, clean, and safe grounds and learning/play spaces.

Student and parent communication tools – Compass Compass is used as our main communication tool, allowing timely distribution of the school newsletter as well as newsfeeds, notification and payment/consent portal for student events, as well as recording student attendance data.	\$10
Student wellbeing and mental health supports These funds are used to support student health and wellbeing.	\$50
School buildings and grounds maintenance and enhancement These funds are used towards maintaining school buildings and grounds including internal maintenance such as painting and general building repairs, as well as grounds works such as garden and lawn maintenance and playground upkeep. These funds also contribute to upgrades and enhancements such as replacement carpet, the outdoor table tennis tables and additions to play spaces.	\$50

• IPAD 1:1 BYOD program

The iPad 1:1 BYOD program is for students in Years 3 to 6.

iPad

DGPS recommends the iPad (A16) 11-inch Wi-Fi 128GB (Model: MD3Y4X/A).

If you wish to purchase an iPad with improved hardware and features the iPad Pro and Air variants are also suitable. Please note, iPad Mini is not recommended due to NAPLAN online testing requirements.

iPad (A16) models can be purchased through the JB HiFi Education Portal on our website or from any other vendor.

If you are wanting to purchase an older refurbished iPad model, please check it meets our minimum device specifications on our website.

Headphones

Headphones compatible with the iPad for students to use in the classroom can be purchased through the JB HiFi Accessories Portal, or another third party provider.

Headphones must be plug in. Please do not purchase bluetooth headphones.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
